

COMMENCEMENT

The term, commencement, has various explanations of origin. Most likely, centuries ago bachelors began apprenticeships; and with the degrees of B.A., M.A. or Ph.D., those graduates commenced their work upon the day the recognition was conferred. Today, students, having finished their preliminary education, set out upon the next stage of life for which they are prepared.

The academic regalia worn at Commencement (cap and gown/hood) is of medieval origin. The scholars of Bologna, Paris, Oxford, Cambridge, Louvain and Heidelberg dressed in a manner to distinguish themselves from merchants and other townspeople. Since the 11th century, when the rise of universities began, "learned clerks" robed themselves in gowns, caps and hoods, thus marking a difference between "town and gown."
